STRATEGIC GOALS

Balanced Industry Mix

Create a balanced and diversified industry mix, which targets healthcare, divisional headquarters, electronics, service centers, and technology and manufacturing.

Retention

Our top priority must be this clear message: "We take care of our own." Our focus will be on maintaining a strong base of jobs and opportunity locally.

Regionalism

Obion County will be the leader in convening more regional collaborations around such issues as Marketing and Vocational Training, and put in place new regional economic strategies with mutual beneficial returns.

Job Growth

Create an average net new job growth of 500 incremental jobs per year for a five-year total of 2,500 jobs over and above our regular growth.

Opportunities for Youth Index

Increase countywide opportunities for local college graduates to find work at home and former residents to return home and find employment in Obion County, and remain competitive within the State of Tennessee regarding this index.

Population Growth

Increase countywide population to 40,000 by 2010, a growth of 22% for the five-year period.

Capital Investment

Increase non-residential capital investment throughout the region as measured by additions to the real estate tax rolls.

Housing

Increase residential building permits in the county by 25% a year throughout the five-year program.

Retail

Increase Countywide Retails Sales by encouraging new retail investment in the county, averaging an annual increase in sales tax receipts over the five year plan of 5% compounded per year.

Tourism

Enhancing tourism and recreation promotion within the County utilizing Reelfoot Lake as a major draw, while developing other accommodations countywide to impact local sales tax receipts.

Diversity and Unity

Increase diversity within Obion County businesses, and encourage the inclusion of African Americans, and Hispanic Americans on boards, councils, and commissions throughout the public and privates sectors.

Education and Training

Establish a Public and Private collaborative with the county and city K-12 programs to help develop job skills with students, add skill development for instructors, encouraging Obion County businesses to adopt a school or a program, to mentor students, and encourage job sharing between teachers and private sector employers.
